The requirements that Kiwa assesses against a product or service are reached in consultation with all parties involved, namely manufacturers and Boards of Experts in a specific professional field. Where applicable, the requirements of international standards are also included.

Kiwa's consultancy services are kept distinctly separate from its certification, testing, inspection, validation, verification, technical knowledge, training and data services. This separation protects against unconscious and conscious research conflict of interest.
